Book Review ~ Rose Legge

I recently bought a copy of Melanie Testa's, *Dreaming From the Journal Page*. After making myself a cup of tea I settled in with my book for what I knew was going to be a sheet pleasure.

Amazingly, she wrote "Dreaming" while undergoing treatment for breast cancer. While reading through, I could see that having this project to finish gave her not only a goal to hold her together but a way to express herself and heal as well.

Melanie has a unique way of combining fine art skills like drawing and painting with art cloth related techniques such as freezer paper stenciling. This results in delightful compositions with subjects from everyday like birds and plants, combined with decorative, more design-y shapes and embellishments. There's an overall feel of bright happiness in her color and line.

I appreciated the way she includes lots of step by step photos of processes - like the many ways to shade a drawing using pen and ink. She makes crosshatching, pointalism, etc., easily accessible to art quilters who'd like to learn to add some line drawings to their compositions. I was most interested in trying out a method of drawing on tracing paper, pinning it to the fabric, and then machine stitching over the lines. I found I loved it and will use it in my quilts. Of course, her focus is in using a journal to explore ideas and translate them to art quilts. Many of the tools necessary for art quilting can be practiced in a journal first, then perfected in fabric art. She has many excellent drawing and painting exercises to talk the reader through beginning journalling, and covers basics like positive and negative space.


Her broad range of fun ways to vary surface design round out the book and give her audience lots to try. Your options are: soy wax resist, cut funky foam shapes for printing, hand drawn lettering, and more.
